While some families may be better positioned to continue student learning using distance learning methods; a lack of access to the Internet and limited wireless data plans present barriers for others. QACPS will likely use Google Classroom once we are up and running, however, equity is a critical consideration. It is important to note that any learning model that is utilized must be accessible by all students.
